Pathways to a Joyful Walk Suggested Discussion Guide

The following guide is designed for groups that meet for about 1½ hours or less.

GENERAL SUGGESTIONS FOR LEADING THIS STUDY:

- Start the study time within 5 minutes of your scheduled beginning even it all are not there yet. Ask a general get-acquainted question that might be related to the study that day or just to help them get to know one another. But do not let this take too much time. I generally used the "describe a walk" question at the beginning of the study for this.
- Then, pray and get started on the study.
- Always read the Bible verses as directed in the book whether they have done the study at home
 or not. I asked specific women to read them as we got there. That saves time.
- You can read the question aloud as written in the study and give them time to answer, or let the one who read the Bible verses also read and answer the questions that follow.
- Choose ahead of time the explanation paragraphs you will read. I called on specific women to read the chosen paragraphs. That prevents awkward silence and wasted time if you are timecrunched.
- Discuss the "Joyful Walk" teaching sessions (podcasts). Pull out any specific bits that you want to make sure they understand and know. I give my suggestions in this guide.
- Consider ending with a worship song. You can find most of them on YouTube with lyrics. Look for the shortest version.
- If you are doing an online study, you can play that song through Zoom. Have it already open and ready to play before you start Bible Study. Click screen share, choose the video on your computer, check both boxes at the bottom, then click share. Mute everyone including yourself! Time delays do not make for good harmony.:)

INTRODUCTION

If you choose to have an introductory session before Lesson One, this is a suggested format. Otherwise, go to the next page.

Get acquainted with each other. Ask a general question or two such as, "Share your name, where you live, and one hobby."

Start with prayer. Ask the Holy Spirit to teach you what He wants you to know in this study.

Introduce the study

- Ask if anyone does not want to read aloud and remember not to call on those people to read.
- Is anyone new to the Bible? Look at pages 1-2 "Bible Basics." Read through the "New Testament Summary."
- Walk through the "Elements of Each Lesson" section (page 3), looking at lesson 1 for an
 example. Tell them they can find the podcasts on any podcast provider but especially on my
 website at melanienewton.com/pathways-to-a-joyful-walk-bible-study.
- Go over "Small Group Discussion Guidelines" (pages 3-4).
- · Ask for any questions.

Pathways to a Joyful Walk (page 5, 7-8)

- · Take turns reading through this section.
- You can ask them to listen to the first podcast as an introduction to the whole study before coming to this Introduction session. If they did, you can ask what grabbed their attention and go to pages 7-8 to cover anything you want to highlight. I had our group read through all of this.
- Ask them to work through Lesson 1 for next time.
- Close in prayer and a worship song.

LESSON 1: START WITH JESUS

Always read the Bible verses as directed in the book whether they have done the study at home or not. Ask specific women to read them as you get there. Choose ahead of time the explanation paragraphs to be read aloud as you proceed through the discussion. My suggestions are below.

Start with prayer.

Ask someone to read the Bible verse at top of page 7.

The Promise of a Joyful Walk

Pages 7-8

• Readers: If you did not cover this already in an Introduction session, ask several readers to take turns reading through these pages.

Page 9

Pathway #1

- Ask question about the enjoyable walk.
- Reader: Paragraph below question.

Christianity Is Christ

- Readers: Each take one paragraph to read through this section.
- Page 10
- You ask question, "What questions do you have ...?"

Who is Jesus?

- Read first paragraph.
- Reader: Jesus is fully human. Read Luke 1:28-33 and answer 2 questions.

Page 11

- Reader: Luke 2:1-7, 21, 51-52 and answer first 2 questions.
- Reader: Answer third question and read 2 paragraphs below it.
- Reader: Jesus is fully God. Read John 5:17-21 and answer question at bottom of page.

Paae 12

- Reader: Answer 2 questions at top of page.
- Reader: Paragraph after those questions.
- Reader: John 6:38-40 and answer question.
- Ask for other answers.
- Reader: John 8:42 and question below it.

Page 13

- Reader: John 14:6-14 and questions below that.
- Reader: Mark 2:1-12 and question.
- Reader: 2 paragraphs at bottom of page.

Page 14

- Reader: Jesus is God the Son. Read 2 paragraphs at top of page.
- Reader: Luke 3:21-22 and answer 2 questions. Read Matthew 28:19-20, answer question, and read paragraph after it.

Page 15

• Reader: 2 paragraphs at top of page.

What others recognized about Jesus

- Reader: John 1:1-2, 14 and answer questions.
- Reader: 2 Peter 1:16-18 and answer question.
- Reader: 1 John 1:3 and answer question.
- Page 16
- Reader: 2 paragraphs at top of page.

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- You read the first paragraph.
- Reader: Matthew 16:13-17, answer question, and read paragraph that follows.
- You ask "Who do you say...?" Read last paragraph on page.

Knowing Jesus Christ

Pages 17-20

- Skip first 2 paragraphs because they repeat what is in the lesson.
- Ask what grabbed their attention from the podcast teaching. Highlight what you want them to know and take turns reading through that.
- Read together the italicized sentence at top of page 20. This is the theme for the study.
- Read through the "Reflect" lyrics and ask the question. We listened to the song instead of reading through it.
- Pray. Use prayer prompts and remember needs already expressed.

Recommendation: Listen to a worship song such as "What a Beautiful Name" which fits very well with this lesson.

LESSON 2: BASK IN THE GRACE OF GOD

Always read the Bible verses as directed in the book whether they have done the study at home or not. Ask specific women to read them as you get there. Choose ahead of time the explanation paragraphs to be read aloud as you proceed through the discussion. My suggestions are below.

Start with prayer.

Read verse for lesson at the top of the page.

Pathway #2

- Ask the walk question.
- You read the paragraph that follows.

Reader: paragraphs at the bottom of the page.

- Reader: Points 1 and 2 at top of page.
- · Reader: quote

- Reader: Read paragraph, Jeremiah 17:9, and question after it.
- Reader: Romans 3:23 and answer question.
- Reader: Romans 1:18-25 and question at bottom of page.

Page 23

• Reader: Answer question at top of page and read paragraph that follows it.

God's wrath against sin

Readers: Take turns to read 4 paragraphs.

Page 24

- Reader: First paragraph and question that follows.
- You ask for other answers to that question and read paragraph after it.

The Cross: God's solution to the sin issue

- Reader: Paragraph below heading.
- Reader: Mark 8:31 and answer that follows.

Page 25

- Reader: Mark 10:45 and question.
- Reader: 1 Peter 2:24 and guestion.
- Reader: Romans 5:8 and question.
- Reader: First paragraph after question.
- Reader: 2 paragraphs at bottom of page.

Page 26

- The Resurrection: God's solution to the life and death issue
- Reader: Paragraph, 1 Corinthians 15:3-8, and 2 questions.
- Skip summary paragraph.
- You read the next paragraph.
- Reader: Romans 8:11 and question after it.

- Reader: 1 Peter 1:3 and question.
- Reader; 2 Corinthians 5:17, answer question, and paragraphs that follows.

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Reader: 1 John 5:11-13 and 2 questions that follow on this page and next.

Page 28

• You ask the next 2 questions. Then, read the summary paragraph that follows them.

Basking in God's grace

- What grabbed their attention from the podcast teaching? Highlight what you want them to know. I had my group read all of the grace, saved, and faith sections on pages 30-31.
- Read together the theme statement on page 32.
- You read the "Reflect" questions. Ask if anyone wants to share an answer.
- Pray. Use prayer prompts and remember needs already expressed.

LESSON 3: GRASP WHO YOU ARE

Always read the Bible verses as directed in the book whether they have done the study at home or not. Ask specific women to read them as you get there. Choose ahead of time the explanation paragraphs to be read aloud as you proceed through the discussion. My suggestions are below.

Start with prayer.

Read verse for lesson at the top of the page.

Pathway #3

- Ask the walk question. Read the sentence that follows.
- · Reader: First paragraph.
- Reader: Next 2 paragraphs.

- Reader: The basis of identity. You read paragraph and ask question. Read paragraph that follows.
- Reader: 1 Corinthians 15:21-22 and question that follows.

- Reader: Answer the second question.
- Reader: Paragraphs at bottom of page.

Page 36

- Reader: Romans 6:1-6, paragraph that follows, and the question.

Reader: 2 paragraphs at bottom of page

- You read first full paragraph at top of page.
- Reader: Romans 5:9-10 and 2 questions that follow.
- Reader: paragraph after questions.

- Reader: Colossians 1:13-14 and question.
- Reader: Colossians 1:21-22 and question.
- Reader: 1 Corinthians 6:11 and question.
- Reader: paragraphs at the bottom of the page.

- You read the paragraph below. Make sure they know this.

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- Reader: first 2 paragraphs.
- Reader: Rest of page.

- Reader: Song lyrics and sentence that follows.
- You read the next paragraphs and ask if anyone wants to share their response.

LESSON 4: CHOOSE WHOM YOU WILL SERVE

Always read the Bible verses as directed in the book whether they have done the study at home or not. Ask specific women to read them as you get there. Choose ahead of time the explanation paragraphs to be read aloud as you proceed through the discussion. My suggestions are below.

Always read the Bible verses as directed in the book whether they have done the study at home or not. Ask specific women to read them as you get there. Choose ahead of time the explanation paragraphs to be read aloud as you proceed through the discussion. My suggestions are below.

Always read the Bible verses as directed in the book whether they have done the study at home or not. Ask specific women to read them as you get there. Choose ahead of time the explanation paragraphs to be read aloud as you proceed through the discussion. My suggestions are below.
